Kate Megason is an assistant DA. She loves her job and is too dedicated to it. She works and works and people call her a ball-buster but she cares deeply hides it. As a 17 year old she and her twin were brutalized, with her sister ending up in a convalescent home and she with guilt and her life changed forever. So, justice matters to her, that is all she has. Her parents never got over what happened and instead hurt her. She gets handed a high profile case that could make her career.

Frank Matrone was a cop, he was also a reservist when he was injured badly in Jerusalem and lost the woman he loved, his life has gone downhill since then. He wallows in his grief and pain and also suffers from chronic pain so bad that he mixes his pills and alcohol. His friends seeing his condition offer him a chance, to work as an investigator in the DA's office. His start is less than auspicious, he walks in late and acts as if it doesn't matter and Kate she is a stickler for punctuality, she tries to get him removed but her boss owes a favor and it is an election year.

Frank is bit of a smart-ass in the beginning but slowly that changes. He finds that their case is not totally open and shut and more is involved. Kate starts getting threats and someone tries to scare her with the past.

The book was great, with a good pace. The relationship is gradual and nothing immediate. There is a lot of working together and getting to know each others history, coming to terms with the past. Frank saves Kate from doing something and that moment was great for me. There were a lot of things going on in the book and I enjoyed it a lot and never felt a lack of romance or anything even though things finally happen after quite a long time.

Picked this up because of high praise for the author's most recent series. I was annoyed with myself for wasting a few hours, but upon reflection this book was pretty (unintentionally) entertaining. The heroine is amazingly tough: after being hit by a car by a bad guy at 5:43 am, she recovers enough to go the next day at 8:33 pm and shoot down another bad guy who raped her 11 years earlier. Despite this rape having inhibited her from ever had any sexual relationships, she then goes home with the Hero and starting at 11:46 pm spends the night having fantastic sex with him. In the literally over the top final episode the next day the Villain beats her up and breaks her arm, then at 2:03 am drives her to a skyscraper under construction so that he can push her off the roof and therefore (!) make it look like a suicide. The Hero arrives at 3:16 am, just as he throws her over. Hero pushes the Villain to his death, is devastated....but wait! it turns out the Heroine had the foresight to find an extension cord, tied it to a pillar and around her waist before the Villain threw her over! Hero pulls Heroine up; they confess they love each other (exact time not indicated, but probably 3:20 am). HEA!

Frank is a retired cop who receives an assignment working as an investigator for the Dallas DA's office. His boss is Kate, an Assistant District Attorney who has been given her first high profile murder case to prosecute. Both have tragic past experiences that seem destined to derail Kate's case.

A clash between Frank and Kate is inevitable when Kate's type 'A' personality meets head-on with Frank's inability to follow the rules and show up at work on time. In spite of Kate's concerns about his ability and worth to her team, the DA forces her to keep Frank on the job even though she doesn't want him.

This is the first non-series book by Linda Castillo that I have read and I found it just as enjoyable and the Kate Burkholder series that I read earlier. Lots of action a a great plot leading to a 'palm sweating' conclusion.

Frank has an equally troubling past and he still has nightmares and terrible leg pain. She is determined to prosecute her cases plus find the men who assaulted her and exact justice. Frank is just as determined to protect her.

Warning -- violent murder scenes and sexual assaults described in the book. I liked seeing Kate and Frank interact and attempt to overcome their past tragedies.
