Black with Cream and Sugar

This novel reminds me of how I always used to order my coffee: "black... with cream and sugar". I meant the pause as a tongue-in-cheek way of admitting I wasn't quite yet equal to just drinking it black.

Mason successfully sweetens and lightens the darkness of her subject matter with endearing female characters and entertaining dialogue. The black acid taste of devastating grief is made tolerable by their plucky get-on-with-it-then manner of supporting one another. Mason didn't overdo it; one knows the brew is essentially too hard to choke down without a bit of cream and sugar.

I will express disappointment in Mason's proofreaders. This book suffers from numerous proof-edit oversights.
