In speaking to teens, she encourages them not to dance for the people of this world and neglect our Father as He is the one we should truly be dancing for. While I find I struggle less with the need to dance for others in the sense that I did as a teen, it is easy to get swept up in dancing to another tune...perhaps looking at this issue in a different way and it was a refreshing look at the things I need to redirect my focus to in life. Chief among them, making sure that my willingness to please others does not overshadow my dance with my Heavenly Father.
