There are not nearly as many solid storytime-friendly picture books for St. Patrick's Day as you would think. This is a good addition, and will be fun to share. I also admit to being a sucker for the multi-hued book

rainbow that the leprechaun constructs in the library while creating his path o' destruction (albeit a limited, mostly mild-mannered path) through the school. It is seriously making me consider doing some sort of "build your own book rainbow" extension activity to complement the story.

Altogether, another solid entry in a fun series that kids will enjoy. Better still, you won't mind reading it aloud (this time, with FEELING!) and maybe also creating a little rainbow out of library books, just for kicks.
