Unfortunately this literary world is full of books that need a whole lot of editing to even begin to resemble a good enough book, but no one is complaining about those despite the fact that the author is getting paid for a crappy book that did not require as much time as a chapter by chapter fanfiction update does.

And while we're at it... Fifty Shades of Grey – it is rather popular these days – a fanfiction story that not only is being adored but is now getting a movie casting.

Since we covered the whole fanfiction thing I want to say that I'm in love with this story. Totally and utterly in love. Yup.

I'm sure I have read the sequel and I really don't want to give away anything so I won't say much... I'll keep that to myself.

Now back in town with a new girlfriend, Kaye has to try and get her answers so she can finally understand just what when through Sam's head when he told her, he couldn't be married to her anymore...

Each chapter has an extract from Sam's novels, which is basically their childhood through his characters.

Epic doesn't even begin to describe it and as the saying goes, don't judge a book by it's cover and I will alter it a little bit and say, don't judge a book by it's fanfiction history.

But like I said, it does get better. What doesn't get better is the steaminess. Why you ask? Because...there. is. **NONE!** That's right...none! So, if you *need* that steam factor, this might not be for you. Hold on though....there's a whole lot of intense romantic feelings with the possibility of more, so that might make it worth it.

That's what really hooked me and I could not put this book down...reading it in one day. It was frustrating as well because I wanted some answers! The problem is both Samuel and Kaye are figuring out things along the way. Remember those secrets I talked about? Well, they start coming out but it's really s.l.o.w. It doesn't help that we mainly get her POV and only get his through his books.

I really loved all the family interaction and the friends. The pranks were hilarious and the extreme sports that they all liked was interesting as well.

Ride the Churning, Restless Rapids of a Second Chance at Love

What a rich and deep adult contemporary romance!

Kaye is in her late twenties and still in love with her childhood friend / ex-husband Samuel (even though it's hard for "stubborn as super glue" Kaye to admit she still holds the candle for him). Kaye is an extreme sports enthusiast, and she and her friend run a PR firm in Colorado. Meanwhile, since the divorce, Samuel has shot up the bestseller charts as a famous author.

Samuel comes from a boisterous Hispanic family, and his sister Danita is about to get married. Naturally, Kaye is Danita's maid of honor, and naturally, Samuel will be in town for the big wedding. Though Kaye and Samuel divorced six years ago, is it possible for them to rekindle a beautiful childhood love?

Kaye is quite a quirky character, and I wonder if the author is equally quirky. There's also much sadness to the story about two broken people trying to mend themselves and each other.

I am so not a fantasy fan and at first I had trouble getting into the snippets from Samuel's wildly successful fantasy series *Water Sirens*. But when Samuel explains why he wanted to write faerie tales for his little "firecracker" Kaye (cutest nickname ever), I fell for the fantasy completely.

Having finished his fantasy series, Samuel moves on to writing a memoir of his childhood love of Kaye, and excerpts from this story alternate with present events. It makes for interesting reading.

There are some humorous moments in the story, like the time Kaye's attorney pretends to be her lesbian lover in order to make Samuel jealous, as well as:

The morning had been spent calmly arguing over the phone with a ski rental client about why "Going down with you since 1973" was not a family-oriented business slogan.

When we exited the theater after seeing Titanic, Hector shouted, "Hurry up, Kaye! There's only enough cars in the parking lot for half of us!"

Kaye describing a spat between Samuel and his posh editor Caroline: *There was tension in Versaceville*

The characters develop in a gradual, satisfying way. Both Kaye and Samuel were young when they married, and have made plenty mistakes. Samuel comes from a troubled background that makes you want to hug him.

"I don't need your pity," he said gently, firmly. "I'm a grown man, Kaye -- not that little boy anymore."

"But it doesn't mean I can't feel pain for that little boy. Or that I love him any less," I quietly added.

I like when Kaye says:

"Samuel, you have to get it into your head that when you shield people -- me, Danita -- from the big, bad world, you cause more harm than good."

This was a touching story and I'm excited there will be a sequel titled *Skygods*.

So for some background here, a girl and a boy grow up together (they have their own language hence the cliff hucker reference), high school/college sweethearts, get married very young...and divorced very young. The story starts off with our heroine Aspen Kaye enjoying her latest extreme adventure with friends. She is 7 years post-divorce and having trouble moving on from her first love. The divorce wasn't pretty, there were some really terrible circumstances surrounding. And what makes that even more difficult is her first love is now like the Nicholas Sparks of the writing world, except he is young and hot (sorry Nicky just saying).

Over the past 7 years, she appears to be stuck in a rut in her small town where they grew up in Colorado, while he is richer than rich, with a new starlet on his arm in the tabloids every week. Samuel Cabral is coming home though, and she is dreading seeing him again. His sister and one of Kaye's BFF's is getting married and they are both in the wedding. She is already nervous seeing him, but oh joy, he isn't coming alone. No friends, he is bringing a date with him.

Oh yeah, it's on beotch.

The "date" is Caroline, long time friend and publicist for Samuel. She sucks..A LOT. So buckle up ladies and gents, this is one rough angst ridden ride.

There are books that I really like. Some I love. Rarely I fall in love with them. I AM SO IN LOVE WITH THIS STORY AND THIS BOOK.

First with Sempre followed by Dusty and now Hydraulic Level Five. **I'm beginning to believe that the best book finds are in the fanfictiondom.**

Kaye and Samuel have known each other since he was the quiet, serious six year old cousin from Boston who was adopted by the Cabrals. Kaye lived next door with the Cabrals and with separated hippie parents,

she wanted nothing more than to be a Cabral. At first she was threatened by him. But Samuel and Kaye grew up together.

Playing by St. Vrain Creek. Guitar lessons. Baseball games. Camping trips. Summer jobs. Prom.

Our first kiss.

First date.

First time.

First marriage.

First love.

First everything, to our detriment.

Until 19 months into their marriage, Samuel tells Kaye (out of the blue) *he couldn't be married to her anymore*. He upped and left and when she found him New York, his betrayal stung so hard that she finally had the resolve to file for a divorce. That was seven years ago. Since then they've only seen each other four times - the last time was pretty disastrous.

But seven years on, Kaye remained stuck while Samuel had moved on. He went on to become a very successful author and a fodder for Page Six articles as he dated famous people. Now, Samuel was coming home for his sister's wedding with his writer/agent-editor-publicist-girlfriend.

With that on the horizon, **Kaye resolves to be unstuck. She wanted answers to provide her the closure she felt she needed - to tie up the loose ends.**

“But...what if getting unstuck meant letting go of Samuel? Not just physically separating myself from him—I’d tried that already, and it hadn’t worked. What if it meant letting go of the love I still harbored for him, buried amidst bitterness, anger, regret? Was that what Jaime meant when she said I wanted to be stuck? If so, I didn’t know if I was strong enough to let go.”

But was this really out of left field? Samuel's claim to fame is a book series where the lead character is largely patterned after Kaye. In the concluding book, the character is called out on her lack of "peripheral vision." In hindsight, Kaye realized that there had always been that unfathomable sadness in Samuel. *She had been so wrapped up in chasing their happily-ever-after, she didn't notice this until it knocked her flat.* She starts questioning the realness of their relationship. Was it friendship love mistaken for romantic love? Did he just simply outgrow her?

Samuel finally offers up answers to Kaye. "Weird symbiotic relationship" he calls it. They were too dependent on each other - *the kind that bordered on parasitism as opposed to mutualism*. It was dysfunctional. And when Samuel could no longer fight this overwhelming sadness (view spoiler), he decided to let go of Kaye. He didn't want to drag her down with him. **But he had never stopped wanting her. And now he wants to mend their friendship. But is it too late?**

It came down to this: was sharing each other's lives (now as just friends) and taking the joys that came with it, worth the heartache (if they find HEA with other people)...Could I risk it with Samuel Cabral?

10. LIE: I don't love Samuel anymore.

TRUTH: Is it possible to stop?

I wouldn't even classify this as NA. I know most reviews criticize the abundance of side characters. They were a bit distracting in the beginning and took a lot more to digest versus your usual NA that focuses mainly on the couple and the token best friend. But I find that so unoriginal and limiting. It was also essential to the plot. Danita and Angel's impending marriage, in particular, provided a stark contrast to their failed one.

Instead of your usual NA fare, this read like a very smart contemporary novel. Rich with meaning yet subtle in its way. The language, the dialogues, the introspections and characters were mature and the story evokes profound feelings from the reader. It is a second chance romance without the trappings of a simplistic plot where angst and intensity (of the dialogue, of the characters and sexual tension) are the driving factors of the story. In lieu of intensity, we get depth. **I experienced the whole gamut of human emotions reading this book** - for Kaye's lack of self-esteem and her struggle to accept things to move forward. The writing was beautiful - not lyrical nor poetic ala Gayle Foman - but equally insightful and brimming with wisdom. If you appreciate deep, complex and multifaceted reads - with so many layers to it, you need to read this.

This was a story of true love, falling apart, lack of communication, guilt, grief, profound heartbreak, anger, self-preservation, self-discovery, mending fences and forgiveness. It is bittersweet. Moving. So utterly poignant
