Deadpool isn't an X-Man, nor is he a mutant. Marvel seemingly just wanted an excuse to do a Deadpool origin story, which isn't entirely a bad thing since I personally knew little to nothing about Wade before he became Deadpool. Still, I think his past should be treated more or less like how DC deals with the Joker's; there should always remain a great deal of ambiguity for these characters. But it would, of course, be fine to have multiple equally-credible (and entertaining) histories floating around to keep us wondering which (if any) is true. But if they decide to do an origin for either of these characters, there needs to be little doubt that the writer chosen for the project could put together a stronger product than this, or else they shouldn't try. And the attempt at an emotional edge Swiervzynski was trying for here was a little too pronounced, and should pretty much never be attempted when it comes to Deadpool. It just doesn't work with the character as we've come to know him.

Deadpool's wacky, fourth wall shattering stories are always different from your usual comics. Here he is interviewing directors for a film of his life story. This is a vehicle for Deadpool to tell his origin story from

his point of view. He wants to tell the cool action packed stories about his life as the Merc With The Mouth. The director is more interested in hearing about his life before the cancer, before the weapon x program that gave him his powers. This gives us a different look at his beginnings. Not Deadpool's story but Wade Wilson's. His childhood, his relationship with Vanessa, how he came to use comedy as a coping mechanism. This may all sound quite deep for Deadpool and while there are some surprisingly touching moments, there are also the jokes (some quite dark and self deprecating) and ultra violence you would expect.

It's a short one, but a good one. I think anyone who likes Deadpool would enjoy this. A solid 4 Stars.
