I review books based on five things: Story World, Plot, Character, Language, and Romance. While my reviews are long, they are thorough and spoiler free, helping you decide if a book is worth your time.

So, this was free and I thought the cover was kind of cool. I grabbed it because I'm doing the reading challenge this year and want to read a lot of books. (I'm doing my challenge in increments of ten, so don't be confused by the current low number.)

Story World

It seems to be based in pretty normal town. I think the authors were implying that it was a smaller town going through some developments. Some people didn't like the change and I can totally relate to that. So, it seemed to be pretty contemporary in this aspect. Yes, the town was probably made up, but it was modern.

Plot

So each "episode" follows a different person. I'm pretty sure the four are the only ones the series follows. It was a different set up for the book. Each episode took me maybe ten minutes to read. I'm a fast reader, though. The episode's follow the characters as they notice something is off with themselves. The characters don't meet at this point, which is kind of a bummer, but I know this book is setting up the tone for the rest of the series. There are obviously four different plots, but you get the idea that they will all intersect at some point in time because some characters live in the town and others are moving to the town. It's pretty cool in that aspect.

Character

Avery- Avery is the first character. She lives in the town and is unhappy with the new developments that cut down an entire cherry orchard to build large homes. The story goes on to show what's off with her and her beginnings.

Marshall- Marshall is the second character. He also lives in the town and has for what I assume is his whole life. He is hanging out with some friends and I don't want to say too much more, but his "ability" is pretty cool.

Hailey- The sporty one. She discovers something off during practice. You also get a peek into her family life.

Israel- He's home schooled, though I don't like the connotation they are putting on home schooling. It kind of bothers me. His family life is... not great. And his ability also seemed the most confusing, but again, things are just being set up here.

Language

There was a reference or innuendo about a guy from a girl. There was the use of the a-word. Other than that,

it seemed pretty clean. Obviously not the cleanest, but cleaner than some things.

Romance

Guys and girls referring to each other as hotties. There were dates being set up and people attracted to each other, mostly for their looks. I'm not saying that's a horrible thing because looks are the first thing we tend to see. And they're all in high school, so there's that.

Overall

Okay, the set up is obviously different and this book, if you can call it that, was short. I rated it three because I did like it, but I don't love it, either. The concept of this book is quite interesting but it simply doesn't work for me. Imagine a TV-series where each episode is only, let's say, 30 minutes long and you have to wait till next episode for the story to develop. Yep, that seriously doesn't work out for me... nope!

The problem with this book was exactly that. This contains four episodes with four different characters (and from four different authors) and you get a glimpse of the beginning of what could be a great paranormal series. You have four teenagers who, out of nowhere, begin to have these abilities they cannot explain. Cool, I like that! But the fact that this book is simply that, the beginning with no development whatsoever was what didn't conquer me.

You don't have enough information to even enjoy the characters, to have a relationship with them because, when you finally start to have a certain feeling towards them, you are suddenly thrown into a different one. And you don't really grasp what is going on because each episode doesn't give details to why these teenagers have these powers.

If this book had a little bit more of background story maybe I would have enjoyed it. But since it doesn't, I don't feel any connection to it.

Though I have to admit that the writing of each author was really good and rather attention-grabbing. The only problem was indeed the lack of development for a first book in a series of episodes.
