Another story in the Wrangler's Creek series, and I hope not the last. In this tale, Lucian Granger, the grouchy brother, is faced with one disaster after the other that his long-time assistant, Karlee O'Malley, has to help him with. If only she can, when proximity to Lucian makes Karlee want to climb him like a ladder and kiss him until he acknowledges her. She's had a crush on him for years and everyone BUT Lucian knows she "lights up" in his presence, something he's not quite seen. Until now.

When his mother, one of the problems in his life, suggests a fake engagement to get rid of the first problem his no-good father presents, Lucian doubts it will work. And he's right. It doesn't. In fact, just about the time he thinks he out from under losing the business and the ranch, one more disaster occurs and it looks like he's going to lose everything.

How this all works out--surprisingly, actually--is a worthy summer read.

The Last Rodeo is the sixth book in the Wrangler Creek series. This one is Lucian and Karlee's story. For the most part, it held up well as a stand alone as it focuses mainly on Lucian's issues with the family business. There was enough back story to get you caught up.

This one was better than the last one in the series. There was much more humor and it made the mood lighter. There were a lot of "madcap" moments that did have me laughing. I loved the resolution for Lucian and his family business. The romance for me was the weaker part of the book. Lucian and Karlee have worked together for ten years. Karlee has always been in love with Lucian, but he has always been hung up on an ex-girlfriend. While I was rooting for them to get a HEA, the relationship lacked heat. This is one of the things I have felt about most of the romance portions of this series. I just would have liked more.

Good conclusion to the Wrangler's Creek series. Lucian, aka Lucifer, is the last of the unmarried Grangers. No one is surprised by this because Lucian can be a real SOB, in and out of the business world. He's well known for his short relationships - thirty-four days is the record. Women take second place to work and he has no intention of changing that. That is until his life begins to implode.

Karlee is Lucian's assistant and has been for ten years. She keeps his life and business organized, often knowing what he needs before he does. She has also been in love with him for years, though he is quite oblivious to it. Karlee has finally realized that nothing will come of it and has decided to move on with her life, giving Lucian her notice and getting ready to start her own business.

I liked both Lucian and Karlee. Though Lucian has been something of an ass in the previous books, it was always because he thinks he's doing what is best for the family. Lucian took over the business, the ranch, and

caring for the family at the age of eighteen when his father deserted them. It was his hard work that turned it around from the debt-ridden mess that Jerry left to a multi-million dollar success. Karlee has done the same for her family, ever since her mother ran off with Lucian's father. She took over care of the home and her younger brothers while her father sank into an alcoholic mess. She had to step up even more when he killed himself when she was seventeen.

Lucian's hard-nosed business ways have put him at odds with the town. That becomes a huge problem when Jerry comes back to town and takes back control of the family business. Jerry's actions put the financial future of the businesses and the family in jeopardy, all because of his own bad decisions. Lucian needs help to stop his father from destroying everything he's worked for, and that means he needs to change his reputation. Regina comes up with the idea of Lucian showing that he's a new man by becoming engaged to Karlee, whom everyone likes.

I liked the development of the relationship between Lucian and Karlee. They have been friends for a long time. Lucian has also felt the sparks of attraction for Karlee but has kept them well buried, not wanting to screw up an excellent working relationship and friendship. He has also been oblivious to Karlee's feelings for him. But the fake engagement has opened the door and now he doesn't know how to cope. I loved seeing how he can't keep Karlee out of his mind, which freaks him out quite a bit. He's kept himself away from any long-term relationships because of one failed one when he was younger - a relationship that still has a hold on him. Karlee has tried to protect her heart, but the "engagement" activities remind her of all the things that she wants to be real. One of the things that she wants is the chance to experience what all his other women have enjoyed - time in Lucian's bed. But just when things look like it could happen, Lucian's ex comes back to town. Lucian's emotions are in a turmoil as nothing feels the way he thought it would. I loved seeing Karlee stand up for herself and tell Lucian that he has to figure out his feelings first, then he could find her. Even with that obstacle, the connection between Lucian and Karlee is unmistakable. I loved how well each of them understood the other. I loved Lucian's protectiveness when it came to her new business and his understanding about her father. It took time for him to sort through his feelings, especially with everything else that was going on. I loved his big moment at the end, as he opened himself up in a scene that was both emotional and funny.

A large part of the story is the family drama that takes place with Jerry's return. He has wrenched back control of the family business for reasons of his own, which takes some time for Lucian to uncover. In the meantime, Jerry's ongoing feud with his ex-wife (Regina) creates some ridiculously funny moments (the taping off of the house into his and hers is hysterically described). There are also some very emotional scenes, as Karlee's mom returns, knowing that it was the affair between her and Jerry that caused so much trouble. I ached for Lucian as he watched everything he had worked so hard for fall apart under his father. An abundance of twists and turns makes the business troubles a convoluted problem to solve. I loved the solution that Lucian came up with, as once again, he is the one the family relies on when there's trouble.

The secondary characters were great, too. Jerry was the biggest presence. Mostly, he was the one I loved to hate for what he did, but there were a couple of times I felt a little sorry for him. Regina was a trip with her snarky comments to Jerry and his fiancée Candy. Candy was a bit of a surprise. She definitely gave off the clueless bimbo vibes for a good part of the story but showed herself to be a little more savvy than expected at the end. Karlee's mom, Glenda's return was unexpectedly complex. I liked her acceptance of the harm she did to her kids, and that she didn't try to give any excuses for it. Her other reasons for returning were quite a surprise. One of my favorite characters was the family cook, Abe. I was intrigued by his mysterious paper bag deliveries to Lucian and truly moved when Lucian told Karlee about them.

I've read a few of the Wrangler's Creek series, but not all of them, so though it's part of a series these are all stand alone titles.

In this book we have Lucian, who is running the family ranch and Granger Enterprises until his dad strolls in and takes over since he has the majority share holding. Knowing that his dad will likely bankrupt the company to save his own ass, Lucian and his mom come up with a cockeyed plan that feels wonky on sight. The plan is for him to become fake engaged to his assistant (and the woman who has been in love with him since her teens), Karlee in the hopes that it would make him a more likeable person and therefore; the town would throw their support behind Lucian instead of his father so that Lucian can take the company over again. That only ends up being a small part of the story because the larger part of this is the company and how to save it.

Of course Karlee knows she's going to end up hurt but she also wants Lucian to retain his company so she's willing to do what it takes. She doesn't expect sex with Lucian but once that happens it seems her heartbreak is inevitable.

The story itself feels so far fetched and almost like the author bit off more than she can chew. There were so many moving parts to this that I had a hard time keeping up but also staying interested. And honestly, the ending felt kind of rushed and it didn't end up being the happy ending I wanted. I still felt bad for Karlee and I wonder if she'll ever get what she really wants out of Lucian? It's hard to say and I can't remember a time when I still felt bad for a main character at the end.

Overall I'm giving this one a 3 star review. It was good, there was some heat, but Lucian is a hard character to like and it didn't have quite the ending I had hoped for.

Delores Fossen's sly humor and clever wit kept me smirking throughout this highly amusing and engaging tale. I nearly bounced in my chair with gleeful anticipation whenever a new character or visitor was introduced as Ms. Fossen's colorful descriptions of their appearance and unique personality traits never failed to bring a sharp and humorous visual. The Granger family was definitely not short on quirky characters, which fit just as well with the eccentric and petty inhabitants of the small community of Wrangler's Creek. Like most fans of the Wrangler's Creek series, I've been more than anxious for Lucian's story. There's just something about the Granger family that appeals to my heart. They're a family I can't help but love and laugh at while being thankful they aren't mine. I can't help but break out in a grin before I open a Delores Fossen book, knowing I'm in for a heck of a fun time. She has such a talent for peppering a moving love story with humor and heart. And The Last Rodeo is about as perfectly hilarious and heartwarming as a book can get.

Lucian Granger was the big brother and boss of Granger Enterprises. He'd taken over the ranch and company at the age of 18. His father, before running out on his family, had nearly run the ranch into the ground. But Lucian had made the company the success it was now. His no nonsense approach to business may have gotten him the name Lucifer from the people of Wrangler's Creek, but if that's what it took to succeed, so be it. Because anything other than success was a sign of weakness.

Karlee O'Malley was Lucian's assistant and girl Friday. She handled everything, thinking of what Lucian

needed even before he did. She'd worked for Lucian for 10 years but she'd been hung up on him since she was a kid. He'd only seen her as his assistant but he'd been much more to her. She'd managed to corral her attraction for years but now she knew it was time to move on. Being around Lucian day in and day out wasn't helping her get over her feelings. It was time to venture out with her own business.

But both Lucian's and Karlee's plans get put on hold when Lucian's demanding ways get the town in an uproar. And Jerry, Lucian's father, shows up wanting to step back in as CEO of Granger Enterprises. With the town holding a small percentage of shares in the company, Lucian needs all the support he can get to keep his father from destroying the company Lucian devoted his life to. And mom Regina has the perfect plan to change Lucian's image with the townsfolk of Wrangler's Creek. Get engaged to Karlee. Then everyone would no longer see him as Lucifer, but as a soon to be family man. Short of locking up his dad and throwing away the key, Lucian and Karlee don't have any other ideas. They could play the lovebirds for a few months and call off the engagement when things returned to normal. But everyone knows there's nothing normal about the things that happen in Wrangler's Creek.

To make it all look real and to avoid Jerry, Lucian and Karlee take up residence in the guest house. But that guesthouse was small. And with most of the space piling up with wedding gifts, they couldn't help but constantly bump into one another. And living in such close proximity with all that bumping was starting to give Lucian "bad ideas". Karlee had always fantasized what it would be like to be with Lucian. Even one of his usual one month long relationships. This engagement was all a lie but living in that guesthouse with him felt real. She was starting to have second thoughts about pulling this ruse off. Lucian was having second thoughts too. He knew the engagement wasn't real but the kick he got when he kissed Karlee was very real. And now he couldn't seem to temper down the thoughts he was having. Thoughts he shouldn't be having about the girl who'd been his employee and, more importantly, his friend for years.

As if the tension between the two of them wasn't enough, they both get the rug pulled out from under them when everyone from their past starts showing up. Soon there's enough old baggage at Granger Ranch to fill the lost and found at LAX. Lucian was the fixer. The one everyone relied on. But he wasn't sure he could fix the mess his family was finding themselves in. And his confusing feelings for Karlee only added another level of complication. Could he work it all out before he lost the business, the ranch, and the woman he was starting to realize he needed more than anything else?

Though everyone but Lucian saw it, he and Karlee were the perfect match. Karlee was so good at working her magic to smooth things over when Lucian's personality ticked people off. I don't think he would have been the success he was without Karlee by his side. Once his mother mentioned how Karlee "lights up" when he was around, he started to notice her. He'd always found her attractive but didn't want to ruin their relationship so he'd just ignored the attraction. Holding on to the pain of their childhoods also got in the way of moving forward. They both needed to realize that who they were had nothing to do with the mistakes of their parents. Once they experienced closure in that regard, I think they were better able to focus on the future they wanted.

The secondary characters in this series add so much to the story. I loved getting to visit again with all the Granger siblings and cousins. Even Vita showed up, which always makes my day. Candy, the Hoo Poo heiress, was hysterical and so outrageous I couldn't help but like her. Regina is my idol! I was in tears when she masked off the entire house dividing it based on Granger shares. Meeting Jerry and Glenda really helped me understand Karlee and the Grangers better. Glenda and Jerry had both made choices that had cost them their families. As much as I hated them for the heartache they'd left in their wake, I kind of felt sorry for them because they realized what a mistake their actions had been. The townsfolk really had me chuckling. Delores Fossen uses such perfectly hilarious imagery to paint her characters. Who knew you could describe people so well with fruit analogies? And I had to google to see if Hairy Corn Salad was real. It is!

Ms. Fossen has such a unique voice in her writing and it really shines through in this series. No one can turn a phrase quite like her. The witty banter and embarrassingly hilarious situations are laugh out loud funny and are paired perfectly with a great romantic slow burn. Nothing about this story was predictable. I was just as

anxious as the rest of the family wondering what could possibly happen next. Just because a book is labeled romantic comedy doesn't mean it lacks seriousness. Unfortunately this book wasn't really for me. It wasn't terrible, it's just not what I look for in a romance. There was no heat or tension between the main characters, which is pretty much the most important thing for me. If I don't really care if they get together at the end then why am I even reading it. And the fake relationship trope advertised in the novel's description is actually only a very small part of the story; if that's the kind of romance you're looking for you won't find it here.

The book was also heavy on the uninteresting (to me) plot and I wasn't a fan of the writing style. It's not uncommon for me to read a romance novel in one sitting but I struggled to finish this one.

I will mention that I haven't read any of the rest of this series, so assuming that these are characters who have been previously introduced, their story will probably appeal more to people who are already familiar with them. There are also a lot of side characters who I'm sure will be fun cameos for readers of Delores Fossen's other books. As a stand alone novel however, it didn't really work for me.

He has a tough responsibility on his shoulders, but he loves what he does, and it keeps him busy, his life and mind occupied, keeping his heart from more heartache and disappointments, making it easy to hide the stiff exterior of 'Lucifer'.

Karlee has had a similar role as a fixer in her own family. The mess that Karlee's mom and Lucian's father left behind was not easy to prepare, but Karlee and Lucien have always done everything they could to help their families while keeping feeling at the bay, to protect their hearts.

There are more twists in the tale that I could count, keeping the family, and the reader, on their toes, inhaling

So... If you've read any, and I do mean any, books in this series you know that Wrangler's Creek isn't your typical small town. It's about as atypical as a fictitious small town can get. The craziness and weirdness that was firmly established in Those Texas Nights (because I didn't read the novella before it, Lone Star Cowboy) carries on into Lucian's story.

The sudden return of his bed-hopping, how-many-times-have-you-been-married-again? dad pushes Lucian into declaring that his lovely assistant Karlee has agreed to become his wife. That plus the fact that he managed to cause an unholy uproar in town. Because, well, he's not exactly a nice person. He's demanding, unyielding, arrogant, and, God love a damn duck, persistent. His bad qualities made for some eyebrow-raising moments but it also had me anticipating how much would he actually change?

See, Wrangler's Creek holds a small percentage of the company's shares. If he wants their support for him to remain head of the company and not his dad, he's going to have to change. For the better.

That was fun to watch. *grins*

Unbeknownst to Lucian, Karlee has nursed a crush on him since childhood but he's never seen her as more. Time hasn't changed that and she's tired of waiting. But just as she's ready to move on and out, he pulls the carpet out from under her and she finds herself where she's always wanted to be--at his side, in his arms, on the receiving end of his touches and kisses--except it's only for a time.

Fake engagement is a tried and true trope, with almost always the same ending: all of the fake becomes real with love and incomparable happiness is waiting just around the corner if they're willing to take a chance. It wasn't easy realizing that when their pasts decided to show up and fill what little empty corners of their lives remained. With everything in an upheaval, it came down to sorting through the mess created by others without losing one another. More specifically, Lucian losing Karlee. She was more than his assistant, more than arm candy, more than his liaison. She was everything, his perfect match in every way.

The characters of Wrangler's Creek are nothing if not amusing and colorful. They mean well, they really do, and they'll go to great lengths to ensure that they are taken seriously even if their antics make the reader chuckle. This story is more than laughter and smiles. There is an undertone of regret from Lucian's parents for the havoc they've caused, the damage they've done. There is a need for closure for both Lucian and Karlee from the pasts that they've allowed to shadow them for too long. But there is an overwhelming sense of belonging, of family, of community that makes Wrangler's Creek the perfect place for the Grangers to come together and begin again.

Ms. Fossen's unique style of writing plus her well-placed and side-of-the-mouth humor made Lucian and Karlee's story a perfect addition to this series. It's beautiful to see the healing that has come to this family and the progress they have made personally and professionally. But I hope Ms. Fossen has plans to bring her readers back to Wrangler's Creek. It doesn't seem like the good townsfolk are ready to wave goodbye to us just yet.

Although, I will give a little credit to Karlee. She was trying. Lucian needed to loosen up. There is no instant love connection between these two. However, I would have liked to see a spark starting to form within the first third of the story. The story had no movement. You could say that I didn't find my cowboy.

Romantic Reads and Such says

As a new Fossen reader, I have no idea what her particular style is but I feel like I should give a few warnings for other newbies. There isn't a TON of romance here, so if that's your main focus you may be disappointed (I've seen a few of those on Goodreads). Instead, Fossen delivers an interesting mix of a couple coming to terms with their feelings, a oh-so-dysfunctional family, and some business shenanigans. It melded together really well for me, but may not work for others.

Lucian is the one that stepped in when his dad stepped out and he's done amazing things to make the family business a success. Unfortunately, his dad is now back in the picture and threatening everything that Lucian has worked so hard for. The big question is why and that plays out through a decent part of the book. It also leads Lucian to making a few realizations – about himself, his life, and his heart.

Karlee has been there by Lucian's side for years, loving him silently, but she's finally reached the point where her heart can't take any more. She's starting to move on when the bad dad drama hits and her feelings means that she can't abandon Lucian or his family. But being in a fake relationship with him means that some things come to light that she hadn't planned on.

Fosser has a fun, quirky style – filling her story with humor, hijinx, and hilarious secondary characters. And because she writes with dual POV, we are there with Lucian while his blinders are taken away and he has to face not only Karlee's feelings but his own. We also get to see the toll that everything has on her. And my heart went out to her all the way to the end.

While I found the love story to be satisfying, it also doesn't play center stage. Those looking for a pure romance may be a little thrown by the family and business drama. It's important for the characters and does help lead to the HEA, leading to growth and helping to put some old ghosts to bed, but it does make up a decent part of the plot causing the relationship portion to be downplayed a little. Not a bad thing, in my opinion as I enjoyed seeing how everything worked out, but also not everyone's cup of tea :)
