Tea For Two:

"Where Two Hearts Meet" by Carrie Turansky is a five star two story novella.

It contains the stories "Tea For Two" and "Wherever Love Takes Us". These stories are about two sisters, Allison and Tessa, who owned the Sweet Something Teashop.

In "Tea For Two" Allison is worried about her shop because the weather is keeping customers away. Then Tyler moves back in town and wants to rebuild their relationship after leaving without a word six years ago, can she trust him again. This is a special little romance about forgiveness and trust and really learning what love is.

In "Wherever Love Takes Us" Tessa is bitter about her husband's past business dealings. When Matt learns he has inherited an old resort lodge and wants to move to Oregon, the bitterness becomes more forceful and it takes accident to bring Matt and Tessa together again!

Both of these stories are only ten short chapters but so full of life's lessons and real life. If you apply the lessons learned in this novella, you will improve your Christian walk even through the book is fiction.

These stories are sweet and a little bit of humor in "Tea For Tea" with a Kiss the Cook apron!

In the first novella, Tea For Two, we follow Allison as she navigates the unsettling feelings that arise when a man she once loved shows up in her life again. In the second novella, Wherever Love Takes Us, we watch as Tessa and her husband work to heal a strained marriage, while trying to understand God's plan for their family.

What impressed me with these two novellas is that they are each ten chapters, but they are packed with emotion and fully defined, well-written characters. The author was able to tell very detailed stories and fill them with tension, attraction, and eventually forgiveness and redemption.

Novella #1 – Tea For Two

Focuses on younger sister Allison Bennett, co-owner of the teashop, and former boyfriend Tyler Lawrence. When I read this first novella, I felt like Carrie was a true sister in Christ. I absolutely loved it. She described the wonderful teashop, and Allison's artwork with an open bible on a footstool next to a cozy fire. She shared scripture and heartfelt prayer. Allison's anxieties were relatable. Going to church to listen to Pastor Tom was just like being there. I actually stopped in the middle of Ch.5 to post on her FB timeline how much I was enjoying the book. Rating it alone, I would give it 5 stars.

Novella #2 – Wherever Love Takes Us

This book felt like a different author wrote it. It focused on older sister Tessa Malone and her husband Matt. They have been struggling financially, and while her baking at the tearoom is mentioned, it is only occasionally. This book involved a lot of fighting/bickering between the couple. They have 3 kids from elementary to college. While the story is very real, filled with everyday problems, I was not entertained (the reason I read fiction). I imagine it may help some women as the couple work through their differences (albeit painfully), but it was FOR ME, too much...just way to heavy. I did not enjoy it. It also leaves us wondering what happens to the tea room, and what about Tyler and Allison who are struggling to get pregnant.

What an incredible book with TWO great love stories!! Reading Turansky's books is always like having a breath of fresh air, she just knows how to draw the reader in and keep them comfortable while satisfying them with great characters the reader can relate to. Whether you're reading a short story, novella or a full length novel....the reader is in for a treat when it comes to Turansky's writings!

Tea for Two

In Tea for Two, we find that Allie is struggling with her tea and coffee shop. This takes place in winter season and the customers aren't braving the cold to stop by. Money is tight and even though Allie loves the Lord, she's not sure how she's going to get through this dry spell with her business. However, she keeps receiving these anonymous checks that cover EXACTLY the amount she needs when she least expects it! She's dating wealthy businessman Peter Hillinger, but he doesn't seem the type who would offer such generosity. Tessa, Allie's sister, continues to urge Allie to stay with Peter so that she'll finally find happiness with the relationship even though Allie isn't convinced Peter is the one.

Enter Tyler Lawrence who is back in town and eager to seek Allie's forgiveness from a past they shared. He's a changed man and eager to prove himself by offering free advertising for Allie's shop, what a great arrangement! Tyler is determined to show Allie he is not the same man who left her 6 years ago without warning, his heart has been transformed. Will Allie be able to forgive him once and for all? Will she be able to get past old hurts and realize this is a new Tyler?

I absolutely adored this short story, it was more than romance....it was tenderness, sweetness, renewed friendship, forgiveness, letting go, and learning to trust God in whole new ways. Peter was predictably unattractive despite his good looks and big bank account. He was a gentleman and it's not his fault he was clueless about how to win Allie's heart. He really did give his best efforts. Tyler brought hope, strength, and faith to this story in wonderful ways. He also communicated his feelings well, didn't play games or act misleading, and it was very appreciated. He was willing to do whatever was necessary to win Allie over AFTER having her forgiveness. He is the kind of character that brings restoration after breaking someone's heart. Don't like the heartbreak part, but it's understandable. Second chances are never easy, but are worthwhile if that's part of God's plan.

Tessa is FED up and has been carrying her frustration for three years! Tessa carries her resentment around her like a shield and no longer shows pleasure when her husband is in the room. To make matters worse, her three kids (Justin, Brie, and Evan) adore Matt and find no wrong in him, which only makes her feel guilt when she loses her temper. Lately, she loses her temper a lot.

Despite the intensity of Tessa's unhappiness, it's obvious she would do anything for her family. She sees her husband as stubborn and determined once he's made up his mind, but isn't that a good thing? In her anger, it's difficult to see the good things about Matt and it's obvious he only wants to do what's best for his family. Will Tessa ever trust him again?

I really loved how Matt handled the difficulties in this story. He gives his whole heart in working at a job that is dull in order to support his family.

Then one day, Matt gets great news that he has inherited property in Oregon from his late uncle. He's soooooo thrilled about this potential opportunity and immediately wants to know more about this venture. It would be his dream to move his family there and have his own business side by side with Tessa.

“Love her. Listen to her concerns. Wait for the Lord to bring her around. Don’t push it.”

It was interesting to read the different hardships Tessa experiences when she doesn't submit to an answer God provides. Both Matt and Tessa have to deal with a distraction in the midst of working for their marriage, but I really liked how they handled that distraction. The moment they fight in the beginning over the Oregon property, the first thing I thought of was....Date Night for them :)

I truly loved how this story is written FOR marriage and FOR family. When mom and dad are having a rocky time, it affects EVERYONE. Even though this ebook was more intense than the first one, I really enjoyed how this family works together through everything that comes their way.

I highly recommend Where Two Hearts Meet for single and married readers. Misunderstandings lead to making up and brokenness brings healing in this fabulous double novella where faith and prayer play a HUGE part in getting God's best results.
