This book speaks to the emerging therapeutic process of discovering past lives, and the wisdom that children possess in remembering them. Stories and statements from small children can be very shocking to hear, and many people might be uncomfortable with their ability to recall previous lives, lives between lives as well as their death experiences. What is being discovered, is, that children and adults can heal phobias, traumas, nightmares and other ailments when a deeper soul contract is discovered.

There is a process to make a distinction between a fantasy story and a recalled life, there are four standards:

- 1) A matter-of-fact tone
- 2) Consistency over time
- 3) Knowledge beyond experience
- 4) Corresponding behaviors and traits

Historically, Judaism and Catholicism both originally accepted reincarnation. There are references in the Bible, Book of Splendor and other sacred texts. Over time, one may argue it was easier to control a population when they were made to think there is only one life and their resurrection and entrance into heaven is reliant upon priests and a strict code of law.

Knowledge of previous lives, deaths and soul experiences can bring great peace and understanding to our human experience. Who is to say children are too young to begin this process? How would you have lived your life differently if you knew you were, without a doubt, an eternal soul on a journey to learn lessons and you would be traveling and seeing your loved ones many times over. Would you be less hard on yourself? Would you take more risks? Would you be less fearful of death or losing loved ones?
