A huge reason that I fangirl over Anne Stuart is because of how true she stays not only to her characters, but to her overall series. The Committee has never been (and I'm assuming never will be) anything less than a hardhearted, cold as ice group of people who do whatever it takes to right some wrongs. That's not to say that everything they do is ethical or legal. Hell no. But they get stuff done, and lucky for us, they give rise to some of the **most** intense heroes and heroines that have been written into romantic fiction. These people are just the same as they were when the series started.

In this book, the heroine starts out somewhat naive, somewhat lonely, and definitely searching for something that she doesn't know is missing. Somehow the universe deems it a fit time to introduce Evangeline to Bishop, a Committee operative and intrinsically hard hearted man. When she witnesses a murder, Bishop's sadistic partner insists on executing her. But as with all of Stuart's heroines, Evangeline has that intangible *something* that pulls out James' (Bishop's) protective side. But only for long enough to save the girl. Then, he abandons her and disappears.

And the rest is golden. It's a mental battle for a man who is as cold as they come...a man who has spent his life living with no emotion and no remorse, not to mention no tenderness or love. And poor Evangeline! Trying to move on and yet tied to a man she still loves, even though he wrecked and ruined her. It's the ultimate in the good vs evil dilemma. There is most definitely some evil in James, but his demons come out to play when his "wife" is threatened once again.

***Consumed by Fire* is the first title in Anne Stuart's new *Fire* series, and is in the same vein as her *Ice* series, with the return of the *Committee* and new operative, James Bishop.**

When Evangeline Morrissey first meets James Bishop in Italy, she is swept away by his looks and charm. After a whirlwind few days, she winds up in Venice married to him. But one morning a short three days later, Evangeline wakes to find James has just up and disappeared, taking her expensive diamond earrings, giving her no explanation. But none is necessary; he was a conman and thief. Or so Evangeline thinks.

But James Bishop works for the *Committee*, the covert organisation that fights terrorism and international crime in ways other international organisations can't sanction. When he first meets Evangeline, she has just walked innocently into a hit on a crime figure. When his partner wants to eliminate Evangeline as well, there is only one way for Bishop to protect Evangeline: marry her.

Fast forward five years, and James Bishop is back. With the *Committee* widening their base of operations from their London headquarters, Bishop has been tasked to set up the American branch in New Orleans. But when the crime family discovers Evangeline's connection to him, Bishop has his work cut out trying to keep her safe on their road trip from the Canadian border to New Orleans.

If you've read and enjoyed the *Ice* series, you know what you'll be getting here with this new title. It runs pretty much along the same lines. I'm actually surprised that this series isn't on more peoples' radars, especially given the popularity of the *Ice* series. One problem here may be that cover. Personally I don't think

it stands out.

As with her *Ice* series, the romance here didn't exactly do it for me. Almost everything between the main characters is sexual, either innuendo or blatant. The answer to all their problems and the mysteries of life itself, is sex. From the first moment he lays eyes on her, Bishop wants Evangeline. He's never had it so good; neither has she. He's constantly dealing with his errant erection. Admittedly, it's pretty impressive.

...but it seemed as if he'd come three times on the same erection, something he would have considered a physical impossibility.

There's a fair amount of sex, but not much romance. Given Bishop's occupation and character, I wouldn't expect too many sappy declarations from him though. Admittedly, Bishop does have some sweet thoughts about Angel (as he calls her), and he has looked out for her (covertly) over the years, with one particular gift. And another gift to her at the end of the book is a real gesture. Both of which are in line with Bishop's personality. But as a reader I need something more than the sex to make me believe in the romance and a happily-ever-after. However, I'm probably in the minority here.

For me though, it's Ms Stuart's ability to write fast-paced action and suspense that really provides the majority of the enjoyment in ***Consumed by Fire***. If James Bond, Jason Bourne and Agent 47 (Hitman) had a love child...yeah, a threesome...he would be James Bishop. Not quite the b*stard that Bastien, the Iceman, is but readers who love Ms Stuart's gamma heroes, will still appreciate Bishop's character.

Although there are brief mentions of characters from *Ice*, this book can be read without reading any books from the previous series. Despite the lack of romance, I really did enjoy the read. It is a little over-the-top, but if you suspend disbelief for the duration, buckle yourself in, you'll enjoy the ride. And maybe even the romance. My four stars are almost entirely for the suspense part of this romantic suspense.

I really liked my first by Anne Stuart, Shadow Lover (4 stars) a quite old romance from 1999, then some months ago. This one, *Consumed by Fire* is the first installment in a pretty new m/f suspense series (a spin-off to the popular Ice series).

A lot of heat, good action and thrilling suspense. There are also some heartbreak touching romantic moments and a surprisingly drool worthy quite nasty anti-hero to look forward to. Maybe a tiny bit to much focus on the steamy parts for this lady, but nevertheless all in all to my like.

The American Uni Professor **Evangeline Morrissey**'s and **James Bishop**'s (an dangerous assassin for the *Committee*) bumpy acquaintance, to maybe be a lovestory, started in Italy five years ago. A priest was murded, the night was steaming hot, life changing stuff happened and hearts were crushed...

‘She was a fighter and she never gave up. Thank God she didn’t trust him—otherwise she would have been trapped...’

“...I’m not one of your polite academics, Angel. I’m something you’ve never seen before, and you need to know who you’re with.”

As if she could forget, she thought weakly, staring at him, into his eyes, shaking so hard she thought she would fall apart. She tightened her grip on his shoulders, and he moved closer still, his strong, wet body covering hers,...’

Quite intense... dramatic, bloody and somewhat raw, but hot, steaming hot, and we know from the start how it will end. If you've never read a book written by Anne Stuart, and want to read the very best she has to offer, then Consumed By Fire would be a fabulous place to start! This is quintessential Anne Stuart and can only be described as a nearly perfect read.

James Bishop is an operative in the top secret Committee (an organization that specializes in covert operations aimed at maintaining freedom throughout the world). The operatives are highly skilled assassins who are capable of just about anything to achieve their objective. They are mercenaries for hire and are ruthless killers.

Evangeline is an American and an extremely brilliant academic. She is a bit naïve and is initially completely taken with the enigmatic James Bishop.
