I loved this series. This last volume doesn't disappoint. It adds some surprises, including the origin behind Doctor Bleak, and wraps up the series pretty well. The creepy-cute style of the manga is on special display here, once we see the children of the Windmill. Poor Meg...you want to hug her as much as she makes you shiver.

The ending is intelligent too. For a story about children, it doesn't pander or feel saccharine. Everything is resolved well (although it would have been nice to see Summer taken down a few pegs more,) and even minor characters show up to play a role.

When the worst thing I can say about a book is "WHY U NO HAVE MOVIE?" and wish it lasted longer, it's a well-earned five stars. Bonuses include a peek into the rooms of Stinch and Miss Notch, and some 4-Kon comics.
