I even stated in my review of the 12th book that I expected this book to be the plot that circles around the wedding. Unfortunately it isn't. The wedding was barely mentioned actually. There weren't details about the planning, decorations, cake, dress, drama, tears, etc. But it was nice to know some facts about it. I guess if Ms. Mercer did focus on the wedding as the plot for this book it wouldn't be as much as a My Sister The Vampire book. So it was okay that the wedding plot plan that I had in my head didn't happen. I understood.

As for Olivia's side of the story: Eternal Sunset filming in UK, leaving Franklin Grove, pause on her education, and reuniting with Jackson. SWOON! I really fell in love with Olivia and Jackson's journey in the other books and when they broke up I completely fell apart as much as they both did.
