Author, Erec Stebbins, takes the reader on a literal journey through time and space. Imagine if you will, having “memories of events that had not occurred.” Experience a sense of déjà vu as Weythrel and his traveling companion, Kloan, traverse the universe in ways that are heretofore unimagined. Once again, Stebbins’ ability to create believable worlds complete with the creatures that inhabit them is apparent. We connect with the heart and soul of the protagonists and understand the desires of his antagonists.

The last of the series of The Daughter of Time Trilogy brings the story to an end. Ambra is facing the future alone without her love Nitin who was actually programmed from birth to be her assassin and stopping him was a blow. One of the Clone's has also captured her Xix friend and confidant Waythrel. As this final book there is much bouncing back and forward in time by the cloned girl, named Klone and the kidnapped Waythrel. He and the reader is also somewhat confused until you catch on she is showing him events that have or will happen from a sideline view, being encased in a bubble suit that keeps them observers.
