Normally after reading poorly written book, I do not continue to read any more books in that series. I read all 6 books in this series so I could give a complete review. After finishing the first one my reaction was that it was written by a very immature person. Imagine my surprise when a character in the second book had the same thought about a book she had read. By the end of the second book I was thoroughly disgusted by the seeming incompetence of the police procedures and our criminal justice system being portrayed in the book. In the third book, a police officer mentioned how writers always get police procedures wrong! All of these things combined with terrible characters, incomplete sentences, misspelled words, misplaced facts, confusing timelines, and obvious solutions, makes this a series that I do not recommend. The main character, Missy, constantly whines and seems extremely self conscious of her weight, yet notes that every man she meets comments on how beautiful she is or at least "checks her out." Even the main premise of the series, that Missy solves all of these murders, is inaccurate. Missy bumbles around, hasn't a clue what is going on around her, and only survives by pure luck. She is extremely rude to people, is highly offended when people are the least bit rude to her, and is unbelievably possessive of her friends.
