This was a pretty good book. There was nothing that stood out for me as exceptional and nothing that I absolutely hated. I am unfamiliar with this author but I enjoyed the writing style. There were a few minor editing issues and some name switch ups here and there that caught me off guard but nothing I absolutely could not deal with.

Dev Bandi and Elliot Gates lived as roommates for 4 years during their time in college. Growing extremely close with each other personal space has all but vanished. Lots of stuff going on in this book. Love the Friend/Teammate/Roommate-to-Lovers trope and this was a good one. I especially liked the dynamics of both main characters. Each POV had a distinct voice with specific concerns. There was never any doubt whose head we were in.

Something I really liked about this book is the balance the author stuck. There was some instant gratification for those who like that sort of thing, but instead of getting stale from peaking too soon, it created a great hook that built up to something better. That is rare.

Also, a pet peeve of many readers is huge time gaps. As the master of the universe, an author who leaves big blocks of time unaccounted for is usually criticized for not using their word/page count wisely. However, this is the 2nd case of Brandon Redstone founding the magic combination. There story jumps weeks, months, sometimes years ... yet there didn't seem to be anything missing. I put this down to the author knowing exactly where they wanted to go with the story, and therefore putting everything on the page so we didn't have to wonder what was going on off the page. It was clear to me that sometimes the characters just needed to live a bit in between the important bits. Instead of getting fake or muddy content, the author showed restraint,

which I appreciated.

The only exception to this is the ending. It was abrupt. Luckily the flow was saved by a sweet epilogue that told us what we needed to know. Honestly, I could split hairs here. I wanted to see how things unfolded in real time, but really, it probably would have only added unnecessary drama. The epilogue gave us the highlights, and it seems like things worked out in less dramatic fashion, so I've accepted the fact that the author was probably right to not add the additional scenes.

The romance was pretty straight forward, the conflict was primarily man-made and took as long as it took, the main and supporting characters were vibrant and interesting, and the tone allowed for some entertaining and heart-felt events during their journey.

Overall, very pleased with this book. I don't usually mention price in reviews because it's so hard to put a dollar amount on someone's art, but *More Than the Ball* is a steal at \$.99. It would hold it's own among books costing 5 or 6 times that much.
