I liked the premise of magic powers and god descendants better in the full length story. Every invented word, power, like "autoported", is italicized. We don't need a special words to know when Stella zaps to the cemetery or Phoebe makes Skittles rain inside.

When cleaning up an accidental shower of Skittles rainbow candies, Phoebe finds three paintings by Stella's dead mother, one by Stella. Stella runs into Troy giving a grass snake to the god of medicine, a favorite offering, asking that he be allowed to follow music, his passion, instead of parental hopes.
